





Where possible in occupied spaces windows are open for natural ventilation as far as reasonably possible without causing discomfort. Internal doors are propped open where appropriate. Mechanical ventilation is adjusted to increase the ventilation rate wherever possible and that only fresh outside air is circulated. Manufacturer's guidance referred to and Professional supplier used where further advice is needed for academies own HVAC system. In the event of significant staff absence, the principal reviews the viability of the academy remaining open. The Principal consults RD and follows OAT protocols. Displaying symptoms of COVID 19 or a positive test	Staff and students	Staff and students are aware not to come into the setting if they have symptoms and must be sent home to self- isolate and follow https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-COVID- 19/self-isolation-and-treatment/when-to-self-isolate-and- what-to-do/ If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the student can return to the academy, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms If a child is waiting to be collected, they are moved to an isolated room if appropriate for age of the child, windows in the room are opened for ventilation. If a child cannot be isolated, they are moved to an area which is at least 2 metres away from others. If the child needs the bathroom, it is separate from others and cleaned and disinfected before being used by anyone else. Schools no longer complete contact tracing this is completed by NHS test and trace.
